New Plymouth's sewage is set to be among the greenest in the country thanks to a \$37 million government investment in the district's wastewater treatment plant unveiled in July.

The money, announced by Infrastructure Minister Shane Jones, will be spent on replacing the plant's ageing thermal dryer – the machine that turns wastewater into fertiliser that is then sold commercially.
